



Upcoming Bible Study for the Year of Mercy

St. Francis of Assisi will be hosting a Threshold Bible Study based on Divine Mercy. The bible study was written by Stephen J. Binz, who is also leading us in a Lenten Mission on the Year of Mercy. "When we study the Bible—both Old and New Testaments—we discover that God's most fundamental attribute is mercy. The God revealed in Scripture suffers with his creatures and has a heart for the poor and the lost. Again and again, God demonstrates faithful love for the world and calls people to a joyful and abundant life. In this Threshold Bible Study, Stephen J. Binz helps individuals and groups open the door to the heart of Scripture—the heart of Divine mercy."

The Bible Study will begin on Tuesday, February 9 and continue for six-weeks. There will be afternoon and evening sessions held at the parish center. If you would like to do the Bible Study on your own or have a group of individuals that would like to meet at another time, and you have a facilitator that can assist you please contact Fr. Tim or Maria Kirk to order the books for you.

The Wedding Feast of Cana Today
 Our land is indeed desolate: poisons float around in the air, toxins flow in our streams and lakes, and chemicals pollute the soil. The land is forsaken because of “the tensions and the tragedies of sin,” and forsaken, too, are many of the people who live on the land. Or, to put it in terms of today’s Gospel, the wine has run out, and the party seems to be over.

However, it does not have to be that way. The people can “be called ‘My Delight,’ and your land ‘Espoused’.” There is still choice wine left to be experienced. The party does not have to end. We can “sing to the Lord a new song.”

Two things will have to happen for things to change. The first is the action of the Lord. Jesus’ hour has come. We must turn to him, as Mary did, and have confidence in his power to effect change. The other thing that must take place is application of our gifts to the solution of the problems afflicting our land and the people living on it. “To each person the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.”

We must all use our unique gifts and unite them in the action of Jesus at work in the world. This is “the way to peace in the world” that we pray for at the beginning of Mass. If we follow this way, “no more shall men call you ‘forsaken,’ or your land ‘desolate.’”

“The option for the poor embedded in the Gospel and the Church’s teaching makes us aware that the poor suffer most directly from environmental decline and have the least access to relief from their suffering. Indigenous people die with their forests and grasslands. Nature will truly enjoy its second spring only when humanity has compassion for its weakest members.”

Pope Francis News This Week

Pope Francis insisted Monday that Europe has the
means to welcome refugees without compromising its
security or culture, saying the continent bears the
"moral responsibility" to care for others who have fled
their homes to seek a better life.

In a speech to the Holy See's diplomatic corps, Francis
lamented the distinction made between refugees fleeing
conflict and persecution and migrants escaping poverty,
saying both deserve international protection.

Human history has been marked by great waves of mi-
gration, he told the ambassadors from the 180 nations
that have diplomatic relations with the Holy See. Hu-
manity today must not let security fears replace the
principles of respecting the dignity of others, he said.

"Europe has the means to defend the centrality of the
human person and to find the right balance between its
twofold moral responsibility to protect the rights of its
citizens and to ensure assistance and acceptance to mi-
grants," Francis said.

He called for a frank and respectful dialogue to begin
among countries of migrants' origin, transit and recep-
tion "so that with greater boldness and creativity, new
and sustainable solutions can be sought."

In his speech, Francis acknowledged fears about secu-
rity in the wake of extremist attacks in Europe, Asia and
elsewhere. But he said those fears should not result in
Europe losing its values of solidarity and humanity.

"Human history is made up of countless migrations,
sometimes out of an awareness of the right to choose
freely, and often dictated by external circumstances," he
said. Citing Biblical accounts, Francis said today's mi-
grants are "possessed of the same determination which
Moses had to reach a land flowing with milk and
honey."
