Catherine's Cupboard

CATHERINE'S CUPBOARD has been serving our community for the past 20+ years, it's open the 1st & 3rd Tuesday each month from 5 till 7 (or until all are served). We serve anyone who comes, asking only for ID, if they have any. As members of SOUTHERN TIER FOOD BANK, we purchase at wholesale (or less), providing basic dry or canned goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, and frozen meats. We try to provide 5 days of meals and include personal care items also. We operate on 100% donations or grants. Our location at the parish center means we have most overhead costs covered. However, we serve over 1200 people, requiring a budget of close to \$50,000 a year. PLEASE tell anyone you know who is feeling food insecure to stop in. If you would like to donate food items, they can be left at parish center or food barrel in church foyer. Monetary donations can be mailed to our parish office or via the online giving tab at stfrancisbing.org



4th Sunday: Lectionary Reflection

Jesus is described as one who teaches and speaks "with authority." Jesus is one who can even command evil spirits to depart. Jesus comes with a clear vision and the courage to speak clearly and boldly. When Jesus is around things happen. Such characteristics are essential for any contemporary prophet who will speak to the world a message of justice and peace. Such characteristics are essential if we are to apply effectively the social teaching of the church to our contemporary world. God is calling us to get things to happen. The clarity of our vision and how it applies to the world develops out of a real understanding of the situation of the world and its people. Our church must be connected with the lives of real people, especially those who are struggling or in need or economically poor. We must come to know one another and learn from our diversity. Otherwise, we cannot be prophetic and speak with authority. The power of our preaching must come out of a deep faith in a God who calls us to work for justice, to ask questions and to speak up. Without the faith that calls us to ask questions, we cannot be prophetic and speak with authority. In a certain sense, the power of our preaching and actions can perform an "exorcism" on the world, driving out the evil spirits of injustice, poverty, violence, and selfishness and inviting in the good spirits of justice, peace, community, and economic wellbeing for all.

4th Sunday in Ordinary: Creation Care Tip

Two hundred thousand Guatemalans were killed between 1960-1996 in a war begun over access to a simple fruit... the banana. Not only has the production of bananas had a huge impact on the people of Guatemala and other Central and South American countries, but it has also negatively impacted the environment in the form of deforestation, soil degradation, erosion, and immense water usage. Consider giving up bananas this week and replacing them with local fruit from your region.

4th Sunday in Ordinary: Justice Challenge

Very early on in his public life people were spellbound by Jesus' teachings and recognized that there was something unusually powerful about what he was teaching and how he was teaching. The listeners in the synagogue in Capernaum noticed that Jesus was using his power and authority only for good. They noted the contrast with the way the scribes taught and threw around their authority. This week, think about who in your life wields authority and/or speaks persuasively and moves people to action. Now, consider, are those charismatic people using their power for good, or are they using harmful or hateful words or moving people to do harm to others? Identify those voices in your life whom you trust are speaking with the love, compassion, and mercy of Jesus, and listen to them.

Prayer: Injustice in the Holy Land

God of Love, Peace, and Justice, Two thousand years ago, You chose the Holy Land as the place of the Incarnation of Your Son. Born poor, he was made to be a refugee, Fleeing to Egypt. Today, Jews, Christians, and Muslims in Israel-Palestine suffer as Jesus did; Hold them close and comfort them. In the Bible, You tell us to welcome the stranger, To respond to evil with truth and goodness, And to treat all people as siblings and neighbors. Empower us to advocate for the rights and dignity Of all Israelis and Palestinians, To reject dehumanization and bigotry In our own communities. We pray that a deep and lasting peace, Built on justice, Will be incarnated in the land that was Your home, Amen.
