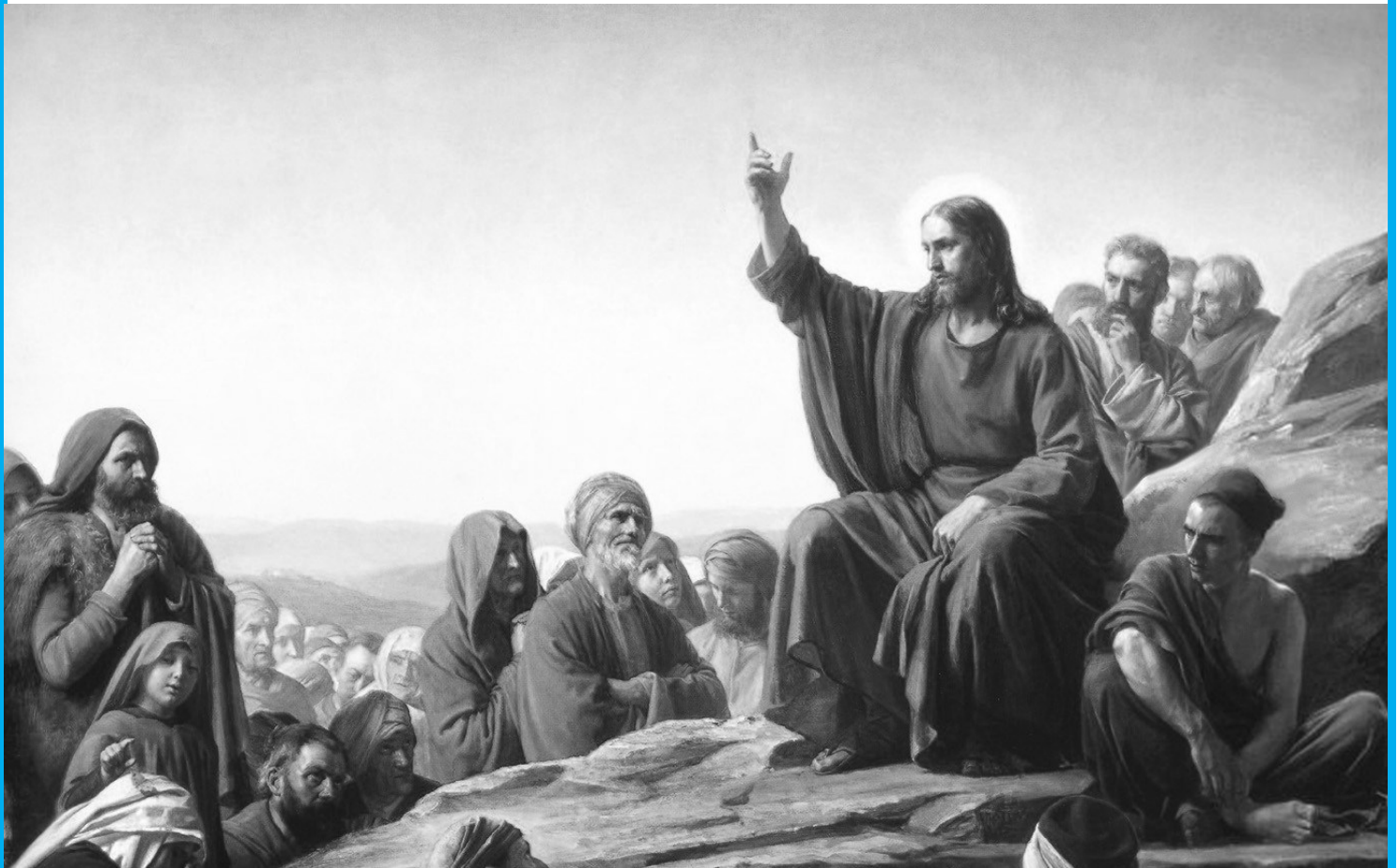

 Next weekend is Super Bowl Sunday, one of the biggest party days in our country. On this day of celebration it is important to remember that families many in our community are food insecure. Catherine's Cupboard serves these families every month. Next weekend after all masses students from Faith Formation will be collecting monetary donations for Catherine's Cupboard, by participating in the national "Souper Bow of Caring" event. This event encourages local schools and churches to collect money and donate all proceeds to a local food pantry. So please bring extra cash or your checkbook to donate to Catherine's Cupboard. Confirmation Class Collection for Homeless

The Confirmation Class is collecting items for Binghamton Homeless Coalition kits between now and April 2nd.
These are the needed items: Drawstring bags, Bottles of Water or Gatorade, Insulated Socks, Thermal Underwear (L/XL), Warm Gloves, Warm Hats, Hand/Foot Warmers, Ponchos, Toothbrushes, Wipes, Bus Pass, Fast Food Gift Card, Clif Bars, Cracker Sandwiches, Oranges, Ziploc Bags. All clothing must be men's sizes, since women can wear them, too; and must be new. Cash donations are also gratefully accepted.

We have a box inside the front door of the school on Sunday's during Faith Formation. There are also boxes at the church and the Parish Center. THANK YOU to all who have been contributing items and cash to our collection! We greatly appreciate your generosity! We were able to provide 7 complete kits and 17 partial kits to the Homeless Coalition on January 20; in time for their point-in-time distribution to the homeless in our community! They told us they could fill in the partial kits with the supplies remaining from what we donated in December. This parish is amazing! Thank you!

St. Francis of Assisi Homebound Outreach

In 2016, 1200 families visited us when we opened the 1st and 3rd Tuesday each month. So many times we are operating on the edge. Our budget last year ran over \$25,000 in purchased food or personal care items for these visitors. - #2 February 12th and 19th weekends BONTON coupons booklets will be available. \$5.00 a booklet gives you coupons to purchase items in the store, February 23—25th. We keep the entire \$5.00 donations, plus get a bonus check from the store (last year it was over \$800 total received).

Communicating Hope and Trust in our Time

*MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS
ON THE 51st WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY*

Access to the media – thanks to technological progress – makes it possible for countless people to share news instantly and spread it widely. That news may be good or bad, true or false. The early Christians compared the human mind to a constantly grinding millstone; it is up to the miller to determine what it will grind: good wheat or worthless weeds. Our minds are always “grinding”, but it is up to us to choose what to feed them (cf. SAINT JOHN CASSIAN, Epistle to Leontius).

I wish to address this message to all those who, whether in their professional work or personal relationships, are like that mill, daily “grinding out” information with the aim of providing rich fare for those with whom they communicate. I would like to encourage everyone to engage in constructive forms of communication that reject prejudice towards others and foster a culture of encounter, helping all of us to view the world around us with realism and trust. I am convinced that we have to break the vicious circle of anxiety and stem the spiral of fear resulting from a constant focus on “bad news” (wars, terrorism, scandals and all sorts of human failure). This has nothing to do with spreading misinformation that would ignore the tragedy of human suffering, nor is it about a naive optimism blind to the scandal of evil. Rather, I propose that all of us work at overcoming that feeling of growing discontent and resignation that can at times generate apathy, fear or the idea that evil has no limits. Moreover, in a communications industry which thinks that good news does not sell, and where the tragedy of human suffering and the mystery of evil easily turn into entertainment, there is always the temptation that our consciences can be dulled or slip into pessimism.

I would like, then, to contribute to the search for an open and creative style of communication that never seeks to glamorize evil but instead to concentrate on solutions and to inspire a positive and responsible approach on the part of its recipients. I ask everyone to offer the people of our time storylines that are at heart “good news”.
