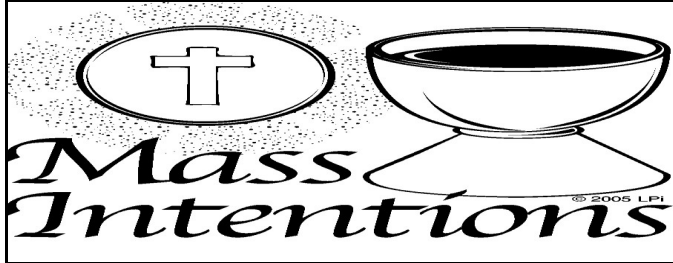

No Faith Formation April 16 and April 23 ~ Easter Holiday

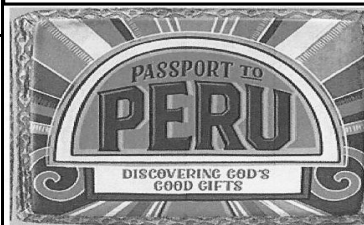

Prayer:**One With The Suffering People Of Syria**

God of Mercy, hear the cries of your people. How long, O God, must our Syrian sisters and brothers suffer injustice? How long must they be casualties of hollow wars?

With heavy hearts, we watch the aftermath of the chemical attack in Khan Sheikhoun in northern Syria.

With numbing grief, we learn of scores of people, including children, who died after plumes of toxic gas fell upon them, like a “winter fog”— Many convulsing, choking, gasping for air, and foaming at the mouth.

They are not numbers, but names, members of a family, our human family. They are mothers, fathers, sons, daughters, and grandparents.

They are the face of your Son—crying out, “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?” (Matthew 27:46)

Give comfort to the father who carried his lifeless little girl, her lips blue, her dark curls brushing closed eyes, wrapped in a blue sheet.

Give comfort to the mothers and fathers as they lay to rest their children in makeshift burial sites.

Give comfort to those who helplessly watched as family members and neighbors fell like leaves to the ground, gasping for air, struggling to breathe, pleading for help.

Give comfort to the doctors, nurses, and rescue workers as they provide care and treatment to those who survived the attack.

Give comfort to those who live in perpetual fear, to those who are internally displaced, and to those who have fled to neighboring countries as war refugees.

Give strength to those who are making a desperate attempt to reach Europe by land or sea, with many dying tragically along the way.

God, as shocking as this unacceptable massacre is, it is but one episode in the long nightmare of Syria’s civil conflict. It is time that the international community stands up and says, “Enough.”

We join with Pope Francis and “appeal to the conscience of those who have political responsibilities, locally, and internationally, to put an end to this tragedy and to bring relief to that dear population which for too long has been overwhelmed by war.” Amen.

**Easter: A Celebration of a New Earth
& New Heaven**

Easter began last night with the most important Liturgy of the Church —The Easter Vigil. The Easter Vigil, our most solemn celebration, retains many ancient elements that point to a time when the divide between the “natural” and the “supernatural” was less pronounced. It is a celebration that incorporates many elements of nature and encompasses the whole sweep of the cosmos. We began the Liturgy in darkness around a blazing fire. The darkness broken by the light of the Easter fire with the Easter Candle. Water is blessed and sprinkled on the assembly celebrating the renewal of our baptisms. Easter is the celebration of New Life.

The themes of life, starting anew and doing God’s will dovetail readily with the message of hope with which Pope Francis concludes *Laudato Si’*. In his encyclical on creation, the Pope recalls the Earth Charter of 2002, which calls us to a new reverence for life. He invites us to promote the common task of protecting all our sister and brother, along with all creation. Everything has been gifted us by an all-loving God. Pope Francis reminds us that all Sundays are celebrations of the Resurrection, and Sunday is meant to be a day which heals our relationships with God, with self, with others and with creation.

Sunday, like the Jewish Sabbath, is meant to be a day which heals our relationship with God, with ourselves, with others and with the world. Sunday is the day of the Resurrection, the “first day” of the new creation, whose first fruits are the Lord’s risen humanity, the pledge of the final transfiguration of all created reality.

Recently, efforts in our nation’s policy is directed at weakening numerous environmental protections, with the recent Executive Order the leadership of our nation risks damage to our air, our waters and most importantly our people, particularly the poor and vulnerable. This Easter week, we celebrate Earth Day, Saturday April 22nd. On this Easter let us be a people who celebrate not only a New Heaven but also a New Earth.

Operation Rice Bowl: Encounter Risen Christ

We prayed, fasted and gave alms—and now we celebrate Easter joy! Our Lenten journey with CRS Rice Bowl ends as we encounter our risen Lord. We reflect on our brothers and sisters whom we have walked with in India, Zambia, El Salvador, Mexico, Ethiopia and Hawaii. And we commit to bring Easter joy to each person we meet in our daily lives. Don’t forget to turn in your CRS Rice Bowl at church on April 30th.
