Catherine's Cupboard

CATHERINE'S CUPBOARD has been serving our community for the past 20+ years, it's open the 1st & 3rd Tuesday each month from 5 till 7 (or until all are served). We serve anyone who comes, asking only for ID, if they have any. As members of SOUTHERN TIER FOOD BANK, we purchase at wholesale (or less), providing basic dry or canned goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, and frozen meats. We try to provide 5 days of meals and include personal care items also. We operate on 100% donations or grants. Our location at the parish center means we have most overhead costs covered. However, we serve over 1200 people, requiring a budget of close to \$50,000 a year. PLEASE tell anyone you know who is feeling food insecure to stop in. If you would like to donate food items, they can be left at parish center or food barrel in church foyer. 4th Sunday of Easter: Justice Challenge

Earth Day falls on Monday. Did you know that care for God's creation is one of the seven basic principles of Catholic Social Teaching? Our bishops call us to walk in the footsteps of St. Francis of Assisi, seeing creation as a precious gift from God, something to be cherished and protected, not used and abused. They specifically teach us that abusing the earth is morally wrong. Your challenge this week is to choose one way you can be "green" and care for God's world. Maybe you will commit to bringing reusable bags to the grocery store so our oceans and landfills aren't destroyed by plastic bags. You might decide to give up bottled water and drink tap water or stop using Styrofoam by carrying your own reusable mug wherever you go. Replacing old light bulbs with energy-efficient ones is a possibility, as are planting a tree or purchasing locally-grown products. Whatever you decide to do, challenge yourself to make this a lifelong practice, not something you do once a year when it's Earth Day.

4th Sunday of Easter: Creation Care Tip

Twenty percent of all CO2 emissions in the U.S. come from driving, and half of those come from cars. As the weather warms and summer approaches, can you savor the warmth and better weather by commuting or running errands on foot, bike, or scooter? Maybe now is the time to dust off the bicycle that's been hanging in the shed for years and pump up its tires. Or what about going out of your comfort zone to inquire about carpooling with coworkers, neighbors, or other families with kids on the same sports team?
