Catherine's Cupboard

CATHERINE'S CUPBOARD has been serving our community for the past 20+ years, it's open the 1st & 3rd Tuesday each month from 5 till 7 (or until all are served). We serve anyone who comes, asking only for ID, if they have any. As members of SOUTHERN TIER FOOD BANK, we purchase at wholesale (or less), providing basic dry or canned goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, and frozen meats. We try to provide 5 days of meals and include personal care items also. We operate on 100% donations or grants. Our location at the parish center means we have most overhead costs covered. However, we serve over 1200 people, requiring a budget of close to \$50,000 a year. PLEASE tell anyone you know who is feeling food insecure to stop in. If you would like to donate food items, they can be left at parish center or food barrel in church foyer. Monetary donations can be mailed to our parish office or via the online giving tab at stfrancisbing.org

Gospel Reflection: 5th Sunday of Easter

Jesus said, "I am the true vine and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit.

Reflection: If God has any "pruning" to do so that we can become more fruitful disciples of Jesus, it can happen when we are attentive to the Word at our Eucharist. What we hear may help us realize how often we have missed or ignored God's gracious outreach to us. Having heard that Word will keep us connected to Jesus the Vine and give us renewed energy and desire to bear fruit as his disciples.

So we ask ourselves:

- **†** When have I felt God has spoken a special word to me?
- **†** What have I done to respond to what I have heard?

5th Sunday of Easter: Justice Challenge

May 1 is Holocaust Remembrance Day. That might sound grim, but the maxim that those who don't learn from history are doomed to repeat it has been proven true time and time again. Remembering the holocaust is a way to ensure that we never experience a similar event. Your challenge this week is to reflect on the holocaust which took place in Hitler's Germany. Discuss as a household what you know about it. Research why it happened, and how Hitler got so many people to try to exterminate an entire race of people. Then ask yourself what prejudice and hatred led up to the "Final Solution", the extinction of Jewish people. Commit yourself and your family to confronting racism or prejudice wherever you see it. This might be as simple as standing up to people who make comments at the expense of a particular group of people; it could mean advocating against regimes across the world which engage in genocide. Whatever you decide to do, hold all of the victims of the holocaust in your heart as you work to make sure that history does not repeat itself. Help the victims to not have died in vain.

AED Training Volunteers
