****HOPE Appeal Update****

The total donations are up to \$27,678.05 (over half way). 78 Donations have been received by the parish directly. The total of those donations comes to \$12,258, \$157.15/donation. The total donations sent directly to the drop box in Albany total \$15,420.05. We will be receiving a full list of donors from the Syracuse Foundations and I will share the total number of donors in our next report.

We now have less than \$20,000 left on this year's commitment. If you haven't donated please consider doing so. Also think about the donations from your IRA if you're required to take a distribution. Remember we are required to pay our commitment each year. Thanks for supporting St. Francis and our Diocese.

Are You Thinking About The Catholic Faith?

The **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and Children** is a process designed by the church for adults and older children to receive the sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation. The goals are to give a complete overview of Catholic teachings and to begin to deepen a Christian spiritual life centered in the Sunday Scripture readings.

Are you:

- A person who has not been baptized and would like to learn more about the Catholic faith with the possibility of becoming Catholic?
- A baptized Christian of another denomination who would like to learn more about and possibly join the Catholic church?
- A baptized Roman Catholic who has never received Eucharist or Confirmation and would like to complete their sacraments?
- A child over the age of 7 who has never been baptized or has been baptized in another Christian faith or has been baptized Catholic and has never received Catholic instruction?
