#### Catherine's Cupboard

CATHERINE'S CUPBOARD has been serving our community for the past 20+ years, it's open the 1st & 3rd Tuesday each month from 5 till 7 (or until all are served). We serve anyone who comes, asking only for ID, if they have any. As members of SOUTHERN TIER FOOD BANK, we purchase at wholesale (or less), providing basic dry or canned goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, and frozen meats. We try to provide 5 days of meals and include personal care items also. We operate on 100% donations **or grants**. Our location at the parish center means we have most overhead costs covered. However, we serve over 1200 people, requiring a budget of close to \$50,000 a year. PLEASE tell anyone you know who is feeling food insecure to stop in. If you would like to donate food items, they can be left at parish center or food barrel in church fover. ## 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Justice Challenge

On August 14 we celebrate the feast day of St. Maximilian Mary Kolbe. He gave up his life in a concentration camp during World War II, offering to take the place of a father who was selected for the gas chamber. He was canonized a saint in 1982. Your challenge this week is to give up something on behalf of another person. It won't be your very life as it was for St. Maximilian, but it might be something you really like. Maybe you are called to give up television to help someone with their homework, or to sacrifice a meal in order to pray for a loved one suffering from cancer. It might be taking money you saved for a smart phone or tablet and donating it to people suffering from a hurricane or typhoon. What are you willing to give up for others?

Why is Synodality important Today? In October way of moving forward that acknowledges that the Church belongs to Christ, that the Spirit is active today, and that all the People of God, together, must prayerfully discern what the Holy Spirit is saying.

What is a "Synod?" A synod is an assembly of church leaders, like the Lutheran Missouri Synod.

Eastern and Orthodox Churches have often used synods to discuss and discern important issues. At the end the First Ukrainian Pentecostal Grounds. of Vatican II, the participating bishops wished to continue having a voice in global Church affairs, so Pope Paul VI issued a document creating the Synod of Bishops. This Catholic Synod of Bishops meets every few XVI held a Synod on New Evangelization. Pope Francis has held Synods on the Family, Young People and issue advisory documents for the pope to consider.

What is "Synodality?" Synodality comes from the paper. Greek work for "Journeying Together." It puts the Holy Spirit first, leading the journey. It is based on the belief that the Holy Spirit lives within and speaks to all the baptized Children of God. Before the Church can move forward under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we must first listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying, especially what the Spirit is saying to those on the margins. This listening to the Spirit's voice, from the bishops to the most remote lay person, is called gathering the "sensus" fidelium" or sense of the faithful (Catechism #92)

To prepare for the Synod we will be praying after communion the prayer that is found in the pews. "Come, Holy Spirit!"

Monetary Settlement Reached in Diocese of Syracuse Bankruptcy Case: Church Entities to Pay Survivors of Abuse \$100 Million

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse and the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors announced that they have reached a settlement agreement in the chapter 11 case filed on June 19, 2020. The settlement will provide payment in the amount of \$100 million dollars to all survivors of sexual abuse for acts perpetrated against them by clergy, religious, lay employees, and volunteers. Although the settlement amount remains subject to a creditor vote and court approval, the dollar figure of the settlement has been accepted by the Official Committee. The Committee is comprised entirely of individuals who themselves survived sexual abuse when they were children by clergy members and employees within the Diocese of Syracuse. Agreement on a monetary settlement marks a very significant achievement in the case, but important issues remain. The Diocese and Committee are continuing to discuss the details of child protection protocols that will enhance measures already in place to protect young parishioners, students, and other vulnerable individuals within the Diocese. The discussions on child protection have been productive, collaborative, and extensive and Bishop Lucia has been personally engaged throughout the process. The Diocese and Committee will soon be in a position to announce an agreement on these enhanced measures that will further strengthen the safe environment program in the Diocese of Syracuse. "I can tell you as shocking as the settlement amount may seem to leaders of our own parishes and other Catholic entities, more appalling and heart-rending to me is the pain and mistreatment experienced by the survivors of Child and Adult Sexual Abuse at the hands of those they thought they could trust, writes Bishop Douglas J. Lucia in his Letter to the Faithful also issued today. "As the present leader of the Church of Syracuse, I cannot apologize enough for the abuse which happened or for any neglect in dealing with it. This is why the final settlement will include commitments meant to strengthen our safe environment protocols to further ensure the past does not repeat itself. "This settlement is a significant step forward in the healing process for over 400 victims in this case," according to Dr. Kevin Braney, Denver CO, who serves as Chair of the Official Committee. "I wish to extend my heartfelt gratitude to my fellow survivors and their families, for their endurance as they have patiently awaited this news. The Committee looks forward to our continued collaboration with Bishop Lucia and his leadership team as we work to settle with the Diocese's insurers and enhance the Diocese's child protection protocols." This settlement between the Committee and the Diocese, parishes, and other entities affiliated with the Diocese does not include a contribution from any of the six insurance companies that provided coverage to the Diocese. The Diocese and the Committee will continue to work in earnest to negotiate with the insurance carriers who are involved in this case with the goal of achieving a global settlement. In Diocesan bankruptcy cases, it is typical for Church insurers to contribute the majority of the global settlement amount paid to survivors of abuse.
