Catherine's Cupboard

CATHERINE'S CUPBOARD has been serving our community for the past 20+ years, it's open the 1st & 3rd Tuesday each month from 5 till 7 (or until all are served). We serve anyone who comes, asking only for ID, if they have any. As members of SOUTHERN TIER FOOD BANK, we purchase at wholesale (or less), providing basic dry or canned goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, and frozen meats. We try to provide 5 days of meals and include personal care items also. We operate on 100% donations or grants. Our location at the parish center means we have most overhead costs covered. However, we serve over 1200 people, requiring a budget of close to \$50,000 a year. PLEASE tell anyone you know who is feeling food insecure to stop in. If you would like to donate food items, they can be left at parish center or food barrel in church foyer. 20th Sunday Ordinary Time: Justice Challenge

This Sunday's Gospel is a tough one. Jesus seems to be calling the Canaanite woman a dog. But she persists, challenging Jesus to see her human need. Jesus is persuaded to cure her daughter because of the woman's enduring faith. This Gospel event illustrates that Jesus' mission was not just to the Chosen People, but to the whole world. Your challenge this week is to follow in Jesus' footsteps. Reach out to someone of a different faith, defend a Muslim who is persecuted for their religion, learn about Judaism, or watch a Buddhist Meditation. How can you model our Catholic belief that Jesus is a universal Savior—for everyone, everywhere, all the time?

20th Sunday Ordinary Time: Creation Care

If you have school-age kids or pack your own lunch for work, make a change this school year that moves you away from single-use plastic baggies or disposable wraps. Make an investment in some high-quality, re-usable containers or cloth snack bags. For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission

This upcoming October the Synod in Rome will be held. This convening is a major event in the church, and it comes after the universal listening sessions that took place two years ago. In the bulletin there will be a regular information about this Synod, and what it means for the church. So let us begin with three questions often asked.

What does Synodality look like? A synodal journey is a process of praying, listening, speaking, discerning, and then finding a way forward. It requires the ability to listen deeply, to sift through what is shared, and then to add the Spirit's voice as it comes to us in Scripture, Tradition, and the Magisterium. It is a way for every Catholic to have a voice, and to have their issues heard and valued. It is a useful tool for parish pastors, diocesan bishops, and Church leadership at every level, to consult with the Holy Spirit and the People of God before making important decisions.

When was Synodality first used in the Catholic Church? The first recorded use of this process of prayerful listening and discernment took place during the Council of Jerusalem around 50 AD. You can read about it in the Acts of the Apostles, chapter 15 in the New Testament.

What is the "Synod on Synodality?" Pope Francis is convinced that synodality may be the Church's best path forward into this new millennium. He has called for a "Synod on Synodality" to explore the issue. It will be held in two sessions, October 2023 and October 2024. For more info visit https://www.synod.va/en.htm

Be merciful to those now wounded. Be present with those now bereaved. You do not run from our brokenness, O God, You move ever toward those in need. Now let your mercies be active through the hands, the words, and the compassionate care of those who willingly enter this sadness to console and to serve.



St. Phoebe Day

Enlightened by grace and taught the faith by the chosen vessel of Christ, you were found worthy of the diaconate and vou carried Paul's words to Rome. O Saint Phoebe, pray to Christ God that his Spirit may enlighten our souls and guide the discernment of the Church that the gifts and voices of women may be received and affirmed in our day for the service of your people! Saint Paul proclaimed you a protector of many, and you became his helper. *Rejoice, Saint Phoebe.*

Our parish will also host a Prayer Service and video discussion on the role of women in the church exemplified by St. Phoebe and recognize the many gifts and talents women have consistently provided to the church. This prayer service will be held in our <u>Parish</u> Hall on Wednesday, September 6th at 7 PM.
