

Catherine's Cupboard

CATHERINE'S CUPBOARD has been serving our community for the past 20+ years, it's open the 1st & 3rd Tuesday each month from 5 till 7 (or until all are served). We serve anyone who comes, asking only for ID, if they have any. As members of SOUTHERN TIER FOOD BANK, we purchase at wholesale (or less), providing basic dry or canned goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, and frozen meats. We try to provide 5 days of meals and include personal care items also. We operate on 100% donations or grants. Our location at the parish center means we have most overhead costs covered. However, we serve over 1200 people, requiring a budget of close to \$50,000 a year. PLEASE tell anyone you know who is feeling food insecure to stop in. If you would like to donate food items, they can be left at parish center or food barrel in church foyer. 23rd Sunday Ordinary Time: Justice Challenge

In today's first reading from Ezekiel has the prophet challenging us to confront those who do wrong. Jesus follows in the Gospel with a similar message. Often when we hear or see racism, greed, or other actions which deny people their human dignity, we remain silent. We don't want to rock the boat or draw attention to ourselves. Your challenge this week is to be prophetic. When you hear someone putting down a person, a cultural or ethnic community, or whomever, speak the Gospel truth and challenge the offender to remember Jesus' example of treating everyone with dignity because we are all created in God's own image and likeness.

23rd Sunday Ordinary Time: Creation Care

Out of sight, out of mind. It can be so easy to trash something or pour something down the drain that will hurt someone or something else "downstream" because we forget that everyone downstream is a neighbor too. What items do you use or improperly dispose of that cause harm after they've left your sight? Sept. 24th @ 4PM: Chaplain Norris Burkes



Fundraiser Carbon Impact Donation

On June 30th the Creation Care Team held a Brook's Barbeque Fundraiser. The proceeds from this fundraiser are intended to support projects that reduce our carbon footprint. There are few activities that we, as human beings, engage in that are carbon neutral. The Brook's Barbeque was not a carbon neutral event. As good stewards of the environment we will donate \$500 (roughly double the value of our negative impact) of our \$2,700 profits to CathCap to offset our ecological damage from the event.

Thanksgiving Basket Sign-up Information

Individuals and families living in Broome County will have the opportunity to sign-up for a Thanksgiving basket. Baskets will include all the items needed for a wonderful holiday meal. Sign-ups for baskets will take place September 6th through October 13th, 2023. Sign -ups will be held by calling the United Way 211 phone number (dial 2-1-1) from Monday -Friday 7:30AM to 4:30PM beginning the Wednesday after Labor Day. Each household will receive a confirmation number from 211. The confirmation number will be needed to pick up the basket. One Thanksgiving basket will be provided per household. Please have information on hand for every person within the household prior to making the 211 call. All families signed-up for a basket will receive a phone call or mailed document 1 to 2 weeks prior to Thanksgiving Day. This will provide information on date, time and location of the basket pick up. Families should expect to pick up their baskets the weekend of November 17th to November 19th, 2023. The Thanksgiving basket coordination program is a joint effort between Catholic Charities, United Way 211, local parishes, iHeart Media and several other local contributing businesses. Installation of EV Charging Stations

In the not too distant future, you will see something new in our parking lots. St. Francis of Assisi will be installing EV (electric vehicle) charging stations in our Church and Parish Center lots. An EV charging station is a piece of equipment that allows folks that have electric or plug-in hybrid cars to charge their vehicles. There are quite a few environmental reasons why this is a project that St. Francis of Assisi is undertaking, but there is going to be a Please remember, if you or another parishioner gets need for an increased number of these stations because there is going to be an increasing number of electric cars. So you may ask yourselves why should a church, our church, be involved in something like this? Most importantly, installing EV chargers signals a commitment to our community and clean air. This initiative responds directly to several sections of Pope Francis's Laudato Si' encyclical:

- The Cry of the Earth- we would helping support the reduction of emissions
- The Cry of the Poor- these stations would be accessible to the disadvantaged in our community
- (§) <u>Ecological Economics</u>- by installing these stations we as a Parish are treating the economy as a subsystem of Earth's larger ecosystem, emphasizing the preservation of our natural resources
- Adopting Sustainable Lifestyles- this convenience at the Parish makes adopting a sustainable lifestyle ier for our parishioners.
- © Community Engagement and Sustainable Lifestyles the Parish is practicing what it preaches by not just supporting, but by taking proactive steps toward tainability.

Because the Parish is in a disadvantaged area the cost to the Parish is minimal and the benefits to the earth are significant. We expect installation in early Spring 2024.
