

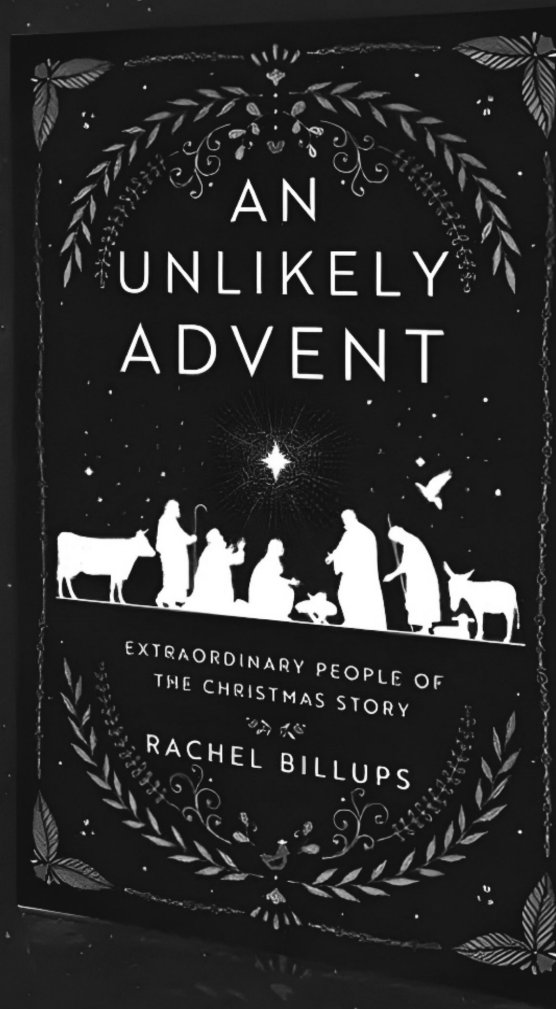

### **Catherine's Cupboard**

CATHERINE'S CUPBOARD has been serving our community for the past 20+ years, it's **open the 1st & 3rd Tuesday each month from 5 till 7 (or until all are served)**. We serve anyone who comes, asking only for ID, if they have any. As members of SOUTHERN TIER FOOD BANK, we purchase at wholesale (or less), providing **basic dry or canned goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, and frozen meats**. We try to provide **5 days of meals** and include **personal care items** also. We operate on **100% donations or grants**. Our location at the parish center means we have most overhead costs covered. However, we serve over 1200 people, requiring a budget of close to \$50,000 a year. PLEASE tell anyone you know who is feeling food insecure to stop in. **If you would like to donate food items, they can be left at parish center or food barrel in church foyer. ### **Christ the King Sunday: Justice Challenge**

The Gospel for Sunday proclaims the famous story Jesus told of the sheep and goats. The way we treat the least of our brothers and sisters is so important to our faith that it actually determines our eternal destiny. Your challenge this week is to go on a mini-retreat (10 minutes is fine). Read Matthew 25:31-46 slowly and prayerfully. Then close your eyes and ask God to help you identify the least of your brothers and sisters. Who are the people whom Jesus wants you to feed, clothe, visit, or minister to in some special way? Now hold these people in your heart as you ask God to help you discern which person or group you are called to help right now. What do they need that you can provide? Live out the Gospel call to feed or shelter or clothe or visit them.

### **Christ the King Sunday: Creation Care Tip**

With Thanksgiving behind us and the Christmas season ahead of us, remember that this is a time for feasting for some but deprivation for others. Make a conscious effort to follow Pope Francis' encouragement to give thanks to God before and after meals. It will "remind us of our dependence on God for life ... and strengthen our feeling of gratitude for the gifts of creation."

### **Caring for God's Creation**

As the season of Advent approaches, can we be aware of the beauty and awe that God brings forth to us through the Earth and express our gratitude and praise? Why? Because God's Earth needs our attention now more than ever before as our Holy Father has very recently reminded us. In an Apostolic Exhortation published last month by our Holy Father Pope Francis titled *Laudate Deum* (Praise God), we are asked to " ...give thanks for God's wondrous creation, within which, God has united us to all his creatures." The Exhortation continues, "...with the passage of time, I have realized that our responses have not been adequate, while the world in which we live is collapsing and may be nearing the breaking point. In addition to this possibility, it is indubitable that the impact of climate change will increasingly prejudice the lives and families of many persons. We will feel its effects in the areas of healthcare, sources of employment, access to resources, housing, forced migrations, etc." As Thanksgiving approaches, let us consider two actions, first that we pray more fervently. May our leaders and communities heed the Holy Spirit's guidance to care for our only home, God's earth. And may we as God's people turn away from greed and power and recommit ourselves to love and justice as Jesus has taught us. Second, may we take some time to reflect on how we might better listen to the cries of the poor and the earth. Our faith demands that we better care for the natural environment with which we live. In Pope Francis' words, " ...every little bit helps, and avoiding an increase of a tenth of a degree in the global temperature would already suffice to alleviate some suffering for many people. Yet what is important is something less quantitative: the need to realize that there are no lasting changes without cultural changes, and there are no cultural changes without personal changes." "Efforts by households to reduce pollution and waste, and to consume with prudence, are creating a new culture. The mere fact that personal, family and community habits are changing is contributing to greater concern about the unfulfilled responsibilities of the political sectors and indignation at the lack of interest shown by the powerful. Let us realize, then, that...we are helping to bring about large processes of transformation rising from deep within society." ### **Christ the King**

It is the Feast of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. One way to understand the "kingship of Jesus Christ" is to look at the images that are offered us in the scriptures. When the Christ is born it is to a homeless family. When he travels around as a teacher, he seems to have no permanent home or dwelling and virtually no possessions. He gathers with the poor, the sick, the tax collectors and those deemed "unworthy" by many in society. When Jesus enters Jerusalem it is on a donkey (not on a mighty horse or chariot). In gospels, the "kingly Jesus is a prisoner of Pilate and will be put to death. The "kingship" or rule of Christ is not the rule of the powerful overlord. It is the rule of the "suffering servant."

### **A Prayer to Christ the King**

*Lord, Jesus Christ, Our Sovereign King  
The beginning and end of all things,  
You have made your Church to be a people  
that bears witness to the goodness  
and beauty of your kingdom.  
By your Holy Spirit, you have united us as one body,  
called to live as one family of God.  
Fill our hearts with your grace,  
that we would be close to you  
by being close to the vulnerable and marginalized.  
Give us the patience to share one another's burdens,  
And give us the courage  
to always be friends of the truth.  
May we remain with you always.  
Amen.*

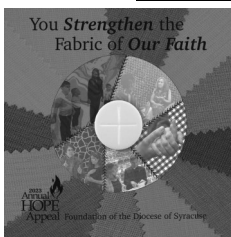
### Thanksgiving Baskets THANK YOU!
