

Catherine's Cupboard

CATHERINE'S CUPBOARD has been serving our community for the past 20+ years, it's open the 1st & 3rd Tuesday each month from 5 till 7 (or until all are served). We serve anyone who comes, asking only for ID, if they have any. As members of SOUTHERN TIER FOOD BANK, we purchase at wholesale (or less), providing basic dry or canned goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, and frozen meats. We try to provide 5 days of meals and include personal care items also. We operate on 100% donations or grants. Our location at the parish center means we have most overhead costs covered. However, we serve over 1200 people, requiring a budget of close to \$50,000 a year. PLEASE tell anyone you know who is feeling food insecure to stop in. If you would like to donate food items, they can be left at parish center or food barrel in church foyer. Monetary donations can be mailed to our parish office or via the online giving tab at stfrancisbing.org

Christ the King Sunday: Justice Challenge

The Gospel for Sunday proclaims the famous story Jesus told of the sheep and goats. The way we treat the least of our brothers and sisters is so important to our faith that it actually determines our eternal destiny. Your challenge this week is to go on a mini-retreat (10 minutes is fine). Read Matthew 25:31-46 slowly and prayerfully. Then close your eyes and ask God to help you identify the least of your brothers and sisters. Who are the people whom Jesus wants you to feed, clothe, visit, or minister to in some special way? Now hold these people in your heart as you ask God to help you discern which person or group you are called to help right now. What do they need that you can provide? Live out the Gospel call to feed or shelter or clothe or visit them.

Christ the King Sunday: Creation Care Tip

With Thanksgiving behind us and the Christmas season ahead of us, remember that this is a time for feasting for some but deprivation for others. Make a conscious effort to follow Pope Francis' encouragement to give thanks to God before and after meals. It will "remind us of our dependence on God for life ... and strengthen our feeling of gratitude for the gifts of creation."

In Pope Francis' words, " ...every little bit helps, and avoiding an increase of a tenth of a degree in the global temperature would already suffice to alleviate some suffering for many people. Yet what is important is something less quantitative: the need to realize that there are no lasting changes without cultural changes, and there are no cultural changes without personal changes."
