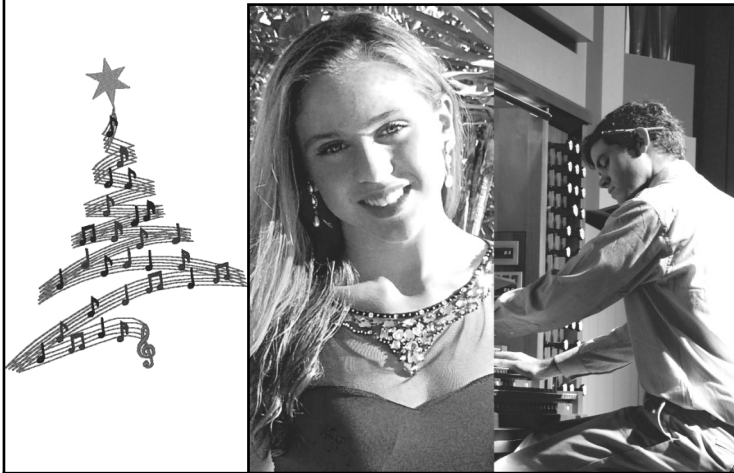

### Advent: A Season To Open Our Eyes and See

The transformation and peace and justice that we long for still seem to be missing. In fact, sometimes we seem only to encounter more war and violence and injustice and poverty. Some say that the world will always be very dangerous. War will go on for a long time. We must arm ourselves to be safe. The way of nonviolence cannot work. Sometimes it seems that the world is only getting worse. We seem to be moving in the wrong direction. When we try to work for justice or show concern for the poor or empower the powerless, other powers seem to rule the day. The power of money seems to overwhelm. The oppression of the poor continues. It looks like wealthy corporations and the most powerful of nations are holding sway over all others. It seems that politics still tend toward corruption or disappointment. Transparency and participation seem to be lacking in our government structures and international organizations. Opportunity seems to be limited to the few. Racism, sexism and other forms of prejudice seem to hold sway. However, Isaiah reminds us that it is precisely the desert that will rejoice and bloom. "Be strong, fear not!" James calls the community to "patience." Don't give up the vision! Jesus reminds the disciples of John not to miss the signs of God's spirit. They are called to see that "the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them." We, too, are called to look for a transformation of values and life. We are called to enter into a whole new way of looking at things. Our faith calls us into action filled with hope.

*You have granted me the immense gift of a tiny little life, living in my own life, and I humbly thank you for choosing me as an instrument of your love.*

**Year of The Poor & Our Food Pantry**

Pope Francis declared this coming year the "Year of the Poor", but here at St. Francis of Assisi the poor are taken care of year round. The food pantry started in the spring of 2002 serving less than 10 families a month. We now serve 100 to 125 families monthly, and can even rise to 150 during the holidays. This is not including the 145+ families that received Thanksgiving Baskets from us on November 18th and during the week leading up to Thanksgiving Day. On **December 19th** we will be open again, and offer turkey, ham, or chicken to our visitors as well as assorted gifts to complete their Christmas. On the 11th our "special elves" delivered over 200 gifts to; The Children's Home, Elizabeth Church Nursing Home, Birthright, and Broome Council of Churches for Jail Ministry. These are "our neighbor's" living within the parish who may not have anything this holiday without **your help**. Words cannot suffice in explaining how much **you do** for the poor. Your monetary donations, dropping off food items, the food drive done by Chenango Forks Girl Scouts, brought in 800 lbs of food in November and Hillcrest Fire dept is doing another food drive for us this weekend. The volunteers who give up their time to sort, shelve, or give out through out the year are invaluable and extraordinary. If you wish to join us, please call Delores at the parish center (722-4388). Whatever you do, it is greatly appreciated and all is used to the best of our ability. **Thank you** all for taking time to care for the poor.
